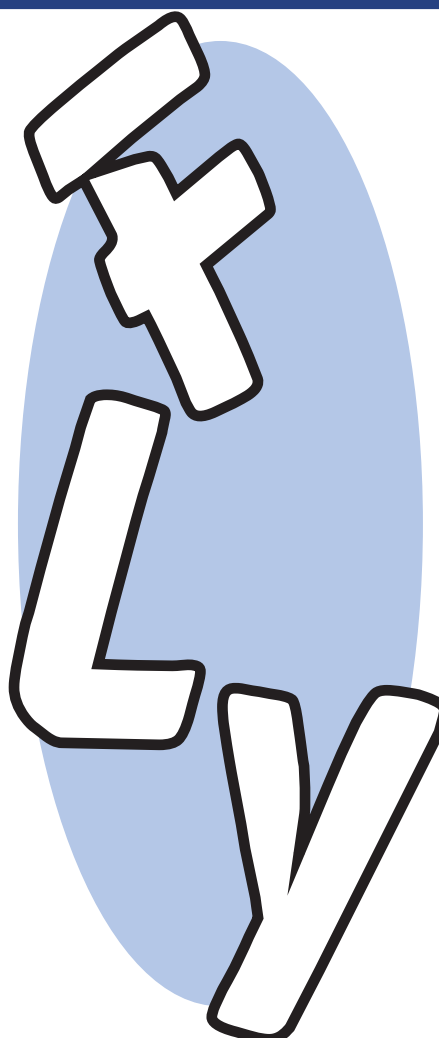

**FLY** but the insect is one of humankind's banes since time immemorial. They have plagued us since the ages. They are common among humans which can speak volumes of one's inclination to cleanliness. The house fly is especially common among us.

Flies rely heavily on sight for survival. The compound eyes of flies are composed of thousands of individual lenses and are very sensitive to movement.

The diet of flies varies heavily between species. The house fly eats a semi-digested liquid created by mixing-enzyme rich saliva with its food.

In addition to being an essential part of the food chain, some species of flies spread pollen, hasten the decomposition of plants, animals and dung,.

The fly life cycle is composed of four stages: egg, maggots, pupa to adult. The eggs are laid in decaying flesh, animal dung, manure, or pools of stagnant water - whatever has ample food for the larva.

Flies are interesting subjects and have been connected to tales about the supernatural in the Kadazandusun community.

Some people in my community believe that the appearance of a single fly at night is an omen from the netherworld of impending trouble. This can be the death of a relative or members of the family in a distant place. It can also be the spirit of a dead person trying to contact the living. Many folk tales have the fly as one of its protagonist.
