Coconut Flavoured Honey

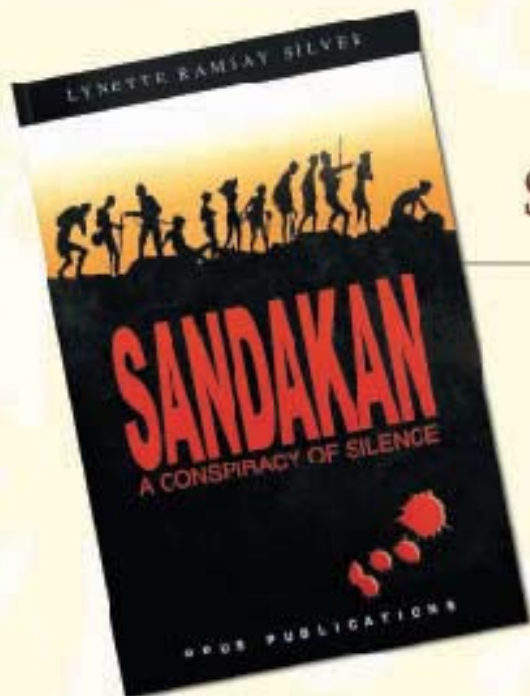

Sandakan - A Conspiracy of Silence

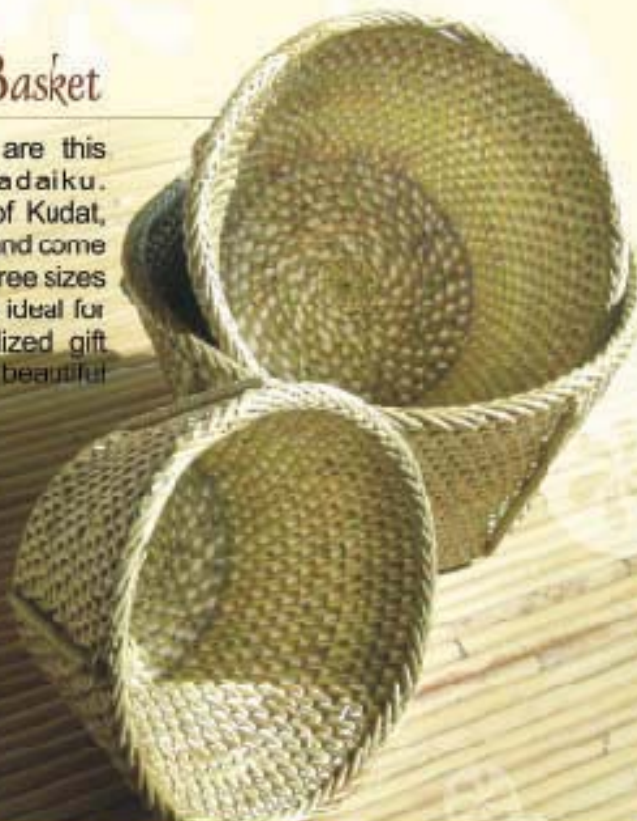

The Sandakan Death March in which more than 1000 allied British and Australian servicemen were forced to march from Sandakan to Ranau by the Japanese Imperial Army during the second world war is an atrocity of war that remains a scar in our history. 'Sandakan - A Conspiracy of Silence' documents the harrowing tale of the soldiers (6 of whom survived) and the failed rescue attempt. A detailed appendix mentions the names of all the soldiers and local residents who assisted the servicemen during the march, as well as a list of recovered relics.

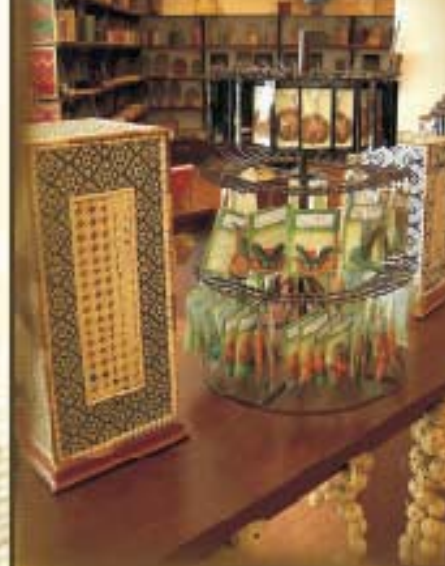


Rinago Multipurpose Basket
