## Gambus Seludang

The gambus (lute) is a traditional musical instrument of the Brunei-Malay community. Its three pairs of brass or gut strings are traditionally plucked with the claw of an ant-eater. The gambus is played mainly for personal entertainment, and its music imitates rhythm of Malay dances such as *joget* and *zapin*. The Gambus Seludang is a product of the Brunei-Malay community of Bongawan, Papar. Made out of the *nyiri* wood, it takes approximately 2 weeks to complete a gambus.

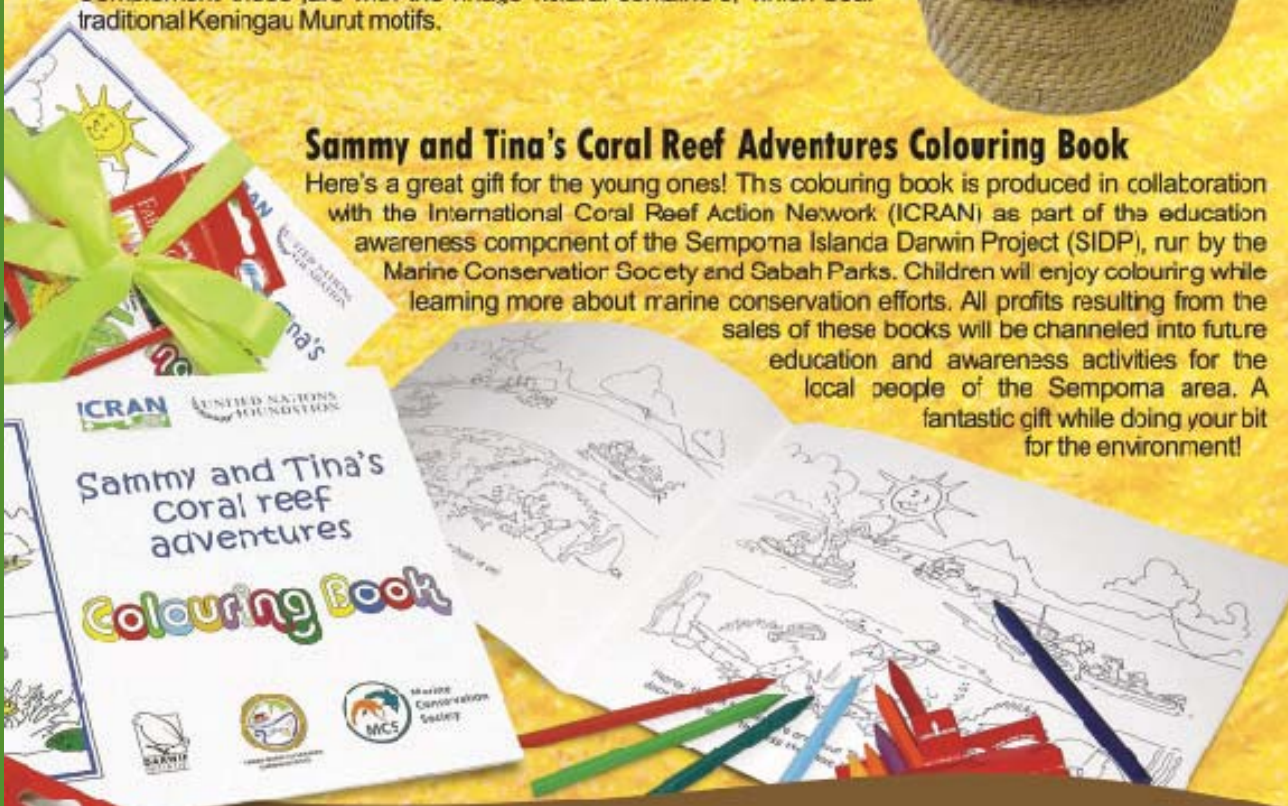


## Rinago Jar Holder and Kelarai Containers

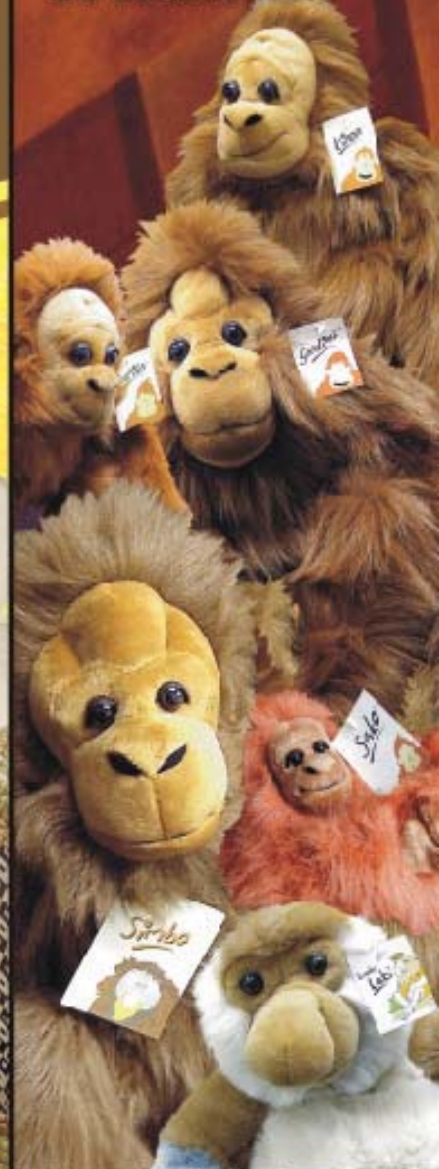

Complement these jars with the rinago kelarai containers, which bear traditional Keningau Murut motifs.
